Next semester, we welcome **Mrs Power's** return on Class 4P, two days in the week. Mrs Newman has been teaching full time on Class 4P while Mrs Power has been on leave. I am confident that they will work together in a job-sharing role, ensuring that high expectations of student learning continue.

External Validation

Last week Curl Curl North Public School completed the External Validation process. I can proudly say that this entire process reassured our team that we have in place some dynamic teaching and learning programs here at Curly. As a result of External Validation, our team are clear on the next steps, which include our school strengthening program evaluation capacity to support school planning and milestone. This will be achieved through professional development for all staff in effective evaluation and other professional learning activities that target evaluation planning. Professional development for the leadership team on effective evaluation will also be put in place to include an increased understanding of the documents that shape school planning. Teachers will be interpreting data (external and internal assessment data) with modification to the school plan looked at more directly to identify the types of data we are going to collect and analyse to show evidence of impact. Through these next steps, we will create a culture where research, innovation, and creativity are core characteristics of the school as a learning organisation.

New Build

An update has been included in this newsletter from School Infrastructure that provides a progress summary. An exciting time ahead as we move into construction activities where our new school starts to take shape. I will ensure that communication with our community on any area of the new school continues to be addressed at P&C meetings and in school communications. It is exciting to see so many interested students and pre-school children watching the big trucks and talking about the construction aspects. I regularly have students approach me at lunchtime to share some of their ideas and planning around the future design of our vegetable gardens and chicken areas.

Semester 2 student reports will be sent home at the end of this term. Reports provide a point-in-time assessment of your child's learning throughout all KLAs for the previous two terms. Our teaching staff collect, record and analyse information about student progress towards the achievement of syllabus outcomes. Assessment occurs regularly throughout the teaching and learning cycle and is used to inform planning, programming, implementation and evaluation.

Assessment of individual student learning informs judgements about what individual students know, can do and understand in relation to the selected syllabus outcomes.

I have the utmost confidence in our teaching staff to identify your child's current level of achievement and to use our reporting process to convey this with you. I invite you to ask the teacher if you are unclear about any aspect of your child's report.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines (2019)*.

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.5 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Curl Curl North Public School

An upgrade at Curl Curl North Public School is underway. The project will deliver new permanent innovative learning spaces and an upgrade to core facilities.

This stage 1 will deliver:

- 40 new permanent teaching spaces
- A new library
- An upgrade to the administration facilities

Progress summary:

The remediation of Stage 1 works are now complete.

Stage 1 building works have commenced. This work includes all construction activities for stage 1 buildings and delivery of materials.

Traffic and parking

To minimise traffic and parking impacts, workers will park away from school and return to site on foot. Kiss and drop zones will not be affected.

Deliveries will be scheduled for outside of pick up and drop off times and will continue via the south end of the school on Abbott Road.

We will continue to share construction updates and project information with the school as the project progresses. We will provide information through information booths, project updates, school newsletters and our website.

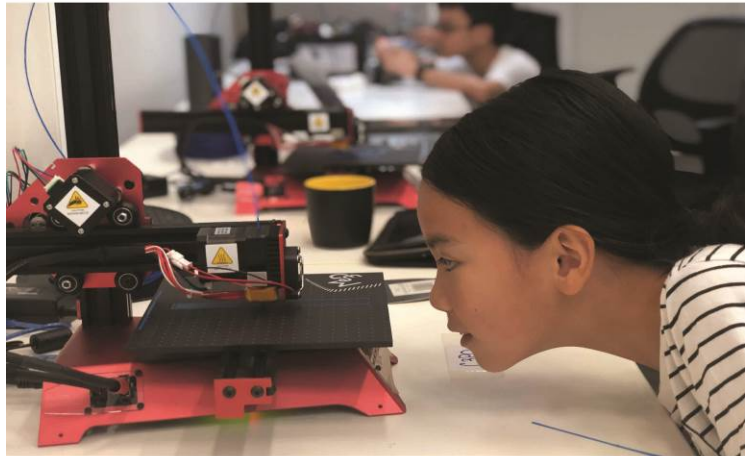

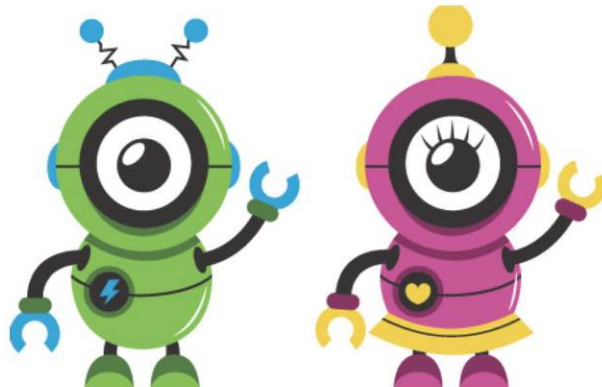
