

Prior to the day, each class promoted their product by creating persuasive posters and making advertisements, using the green screen. These advertisements were then uploaded and emailed to each class within the school to promote the products being sold on the day.

This was a great way to bring closure to our unit 'From the land to the hand' and allowed us to raise some funds for our farmers who are doing it tough, in this drought.

Instructional Leadership

Instructional Leadership is an integral component of our teaching here at Curl Curl North Public School. Educators support each other to deliver the curriculum and to continually enhance our professional development. In ES1 (Kindergarten), the teachers are co-teaching with Mrs Reinhardt – the ES1 Instructional Leader. This term, the focus is grammar and punctuation.

As we delve into the magical world of fairy tales, adjectives are very pertinent to this topic. What fun we had together! Mrs Reinhardt produced a magic box, a student selected a mystery fairy tale item (for example, a crown), placed it in the magic box, and then used adjectives to describe the item. The class then used these adjectives to solve and name the mysterious item in the box. Collaborative peer groups ensued, with students working together to use adjectives to describe some fairy tale characters! Grammar techniques will assist our students to further develop writing and representing skills. Thank you Mrs Reinhardt!


Library News



Seaforth Public School Community Nature Playground - PUBLIC VOTE

The Seaforth Public School Parents & Citizens Association is undertaking a nature playground project at the school's Kempbridge Avenue campus. The playground, on the site of the 2015 school fire which destroyed 2 classrooms, will be available for use by the entire community.

There is a little bit of legwork, as you need to log in using your Medicare number and vote for at least three projects, but there are many worthwhile projects submitted, so by voting you will be doing your bit for the Manly electorate. Hopefully you put our nature playground project as your number-one choical.

Why? Studies show natural playgrounds provide better opportunities for children to develop gross-motor skills than modular playgrounds. Contact with nature is associated with health benefits for children, such as reduced sickness and stress, reduced rates of bullying behaviour, lower rates of obesity, improved cognitive function, increased creativity, improved interaction with adults, and reduced rates of aggression, anxiety and depression. Plus, they're just plain good fun.

The nature playground will occupy space adjoining the school library and will overlook an existing garden with shade, benches, and seating. A great asset to our community!
